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





To Whom It May Concern:

Palm Beach County plans to secure Federal funding to construct 7 ft buffered bicycle lanes on both sides of Camino Real from Spanish River Road to S. Ocean Boulevard. Also included in the project is construction of the missing sidewalk on the south side between Spanish River Road and Banyan Road (see attached location map). This project is designated as a priority bike corridor by Palm Beach County Transportation Planning Agency (TPA) and is supported by the City of Boca Raton. It will enhance the safety of bicycle riders and pedestrians utilizing the corridor to access adjacent resorts, residential housing, recreation activities, and beach access. It also improves pedestrian safety along the sidewalk as it reduces conflict between bikers and pedestrians. If funding is secured, construction of the bicycle lanes and sidewalk will be scheduled in year 2026.

Construction and subsequent maintenance costs will be borne by the County at no cost whatsoever to the property owners. The bicycle lanes and sidewalk will be built within the existing County road right-of-way.

Thank you for your consideration and for sharing your ideas for a proposed sidewalk/bike path fronting my Camino Real home. I am adamantly opposed to the county's plan.

I am a 28 year resident here on Camino Real. Our five, fee-simple townhomes are historic along this sharply curved, brief and narrow stretch from A1A to Camino Real, which leads to our narrow historic little bridge. Our stretch between the bridge and A1A is a blind curve and has already witnessed many serious accidents. Especially dangerous conditions exist at the Camino Real intersections of Banyan Road and also Cocoanut and Spanish River Roads.

Many years back, there was a plan based around the same idea brought before the City Council and it was unanimously ruled down due to the safety issues that would result.

Adding an additional strip of unnecessary sidewalks and bike paths on this short curved side would not only create a sense of false security and safety for pedestrians and bikers, but also this addition would seriously limit my and my neighbors' safe driving access to and from our homes.

While my husband and I thank you for the information regarding the proposed sidewalk and bicycle lanes on Camino Real we **fervently** oppose the plan. Hopefully you have done traffic studies (I have not seen any of the car counters in a along time) and are aware of the many accidents especially at the corner of Camino and Banyan. If the bike lanes and sidewalks are added there is a huge potential for pedestrian accidents as well from cars entering Camino from Banyan. This is a busy street as I hope you know and is too narrow for these two additions. Also the two other streets (Spanish River and Coconut Road) incur long waits to enter Camino due to the bridge openings and busy traffic. Adding a sidewalk on the south side will add more wait time and driver frustration and again, danger to the pedestrians. There is, as I hope you know, an existing sidewalk on the north side of Camino which serves the pedestrians well now. Also, note there is not a south side sidewalk on the west side of the bridge. Why does there have to be one on the east side of the bridge?

As to the bike lanes the road is too narrow for a safe environment for this use. I know Bicycle fervor is all the rage now but not on this street.

The proposal to add a sidewalk and/or bike lanes on the south side of the Camino Real bridge is an incredibly dangerous idea for both pedestrians and cyclists. Bicycles, motorized vehicles AND pedestrians already have a difficult time exiting Spanish River Road and Banyan Road onto Camino! When the bridge goes down, traffic comes streaming across the bridge and side streets to the south have a perilous time entering Camino. This occurs every 20 minutes. Condominiums, rental apartments, The Waterstone Hotel and single family residences in the Estates section, are affected every 20 minutes when the bridge goes up. The traffic alone could be hazardous to pedestrians. Obviously, we can not have traffic lights on every corner!

The sidewalk on the NORTH side works fine. There is clear visibility for approaching vehicles, bikes and pedestrians. NOT so from the corners on the west side of Camino.

This is a dangerous and bad idea.

We suggest that a traffic engineer try exiting Banyan Road (or any of the side streets east of the bridge) after it opens and cars start to drive over the bridge!
