

Existing Safety Measures



- Crossing Exit Gates
 - All State Road Crossings Except SR 704 and SR 804
- Pedestrian Gates
 - All State Road Crossings
- Rail Dynamic Envelopes Medians
 - All State Road Crossings
- Delineators, Raised Pavement Markers, and Edge Striping
 - Multiple Locations
- Fencing and/or Landscaping
 - Multiple Locations
- "Do Not Stop on Tracks" and Crisis Support Signage
 - Multiple Locations





East Coast Corridor Trespassing and Intrusion Mitigation Project



FDOT was awarded a \$25 million federal RAISE Grant to enhance safety between Miami-Dade and Brevard counties

- Federal Grant Funding: \$25 million
- Brightline & FDOT match: \$10 million each
- Estimated Total Project Costs: \$45 million

The project mitigations aim to reduce the two primary types of crashes

- Vehicle collisions
- Trespasser strikes

The supplemental safety measures to be installed include are:

- Rail Dynamic Envelopes
- Delineators, Raised Pavement Markers, and Edge Striping
- Fencing and/or Landscaping
- "Do Not Stop on Tracks" and Crisis Support Signage

Onsite Signal Safety Improvements (OSSI)



Grant Funding: \$12.9 million

FDOT match: \$9.8 million

Estimated Total Project Costs: \$22.75 million


- The project is located on the South Florida Rail Corridor (SFRC) spanning from Miami-Dade to Broward
- The project will modernize 25 critical, dated, at-grade railroad crossings by replacing 35 signal houses, 34 gate mechanisms, 7 cantilevers, and more than 70 light assemblies at the most traveled crossings along the SFRC.
- Palm Beach County Crossings included in this grant:
 - 45th Street
 - Palm Beach Lakes Blvd.
 - Belvedere Road
 - Forest Hill Blvd.

- South 6th Ave.
- Atlantic Ave.
- Linton Blvd.
- Palmetto Park Rd.





Traffic Signal Preemption



Preemption required if any of the following:

- Traffic Signal within 200 ft. of railroad crossing
- Highway traffic queues have potential to extend across railroad crossing
- Traffic backed up from nearby downstream RR crossing could interfere with a signalized intersection


A study to determine the need for preemption is required for a signal within 500 ft of a railroad crossing

- Three proposed locations in FEC/Brightline corridor
 - Indiantown Road (SR 706)
 - Blue Heron Blvd. (SR 708)
 - Dr. MLK Jr. Blvd. (SR 710)
