

# LOCAL GOVERNMENT APPROACH





#### **DEVELOPMENT FUNDING**

PBC Department of Housing and Economic Development administers programs to fund development of affordable and workforce housing.

- Traditional approach to subsidize affordable development
- Federal, State, and local sources for gap funding
- Permanent financing of multifamily rental
- Construction financing of single family for-sale
- 30+ year affordability
- Funds offered through competitive processes



### **INCLUSIONARY ZONING**

PBC Workforce Housing Program is mandatory inclusionary zoning program to increase housing for 60-140% AMI.

- Urban/Suburban Tier of unincorporated county
- All projects with 10 or more residential units
- Developer may meet obligation through:
  - Construction on-site or off-site
  - Partner with affordable/workforce builder
  - Payment of in-lieu fee
  - Purchase of market rate units
- 101 projects with 3,300+ WHP units obligated



### **HOUSING BOND**

PBC voters and Board of County Commissioners approved issuance of \$200M general obligation bond to increase affordable/workforce housing.

- Rental or for-sale (multifamily, single family, condo)
- Bond proceeds will fund loans to developers
- Permanent financing for multifamily/rental
- Construction financing for single family/for-sale
- At least 10% of units in project affordable/workforce
- 30 year affordability for rental / 15 year for-sale
- Bonds to be issued in tranches
- Funds to be offered through competitive process



## **DEPT. OF COMMUNITY SERVICES**

PBC Community Services Department serves the housing needs of most vulnerable low-income populations including homeless and working poor.

- Emergency rental assistance to prevent eviction
- Rapid re-housing of homeless individuals/families
- Emergency shelter (4 county facilities)
- Construction of central county homeless resource center nearing completion
- Funds services delivered by numerous partner agencies
