


WALK BIKE SAFETY AUDIT

Lake Worth Middle School

Date Conducted: January 11, 2023 Location: Lake Worth Beach, FL

The Palm Beach TPA conducted a Walk Bike Safety Audit to improve the walking and biking conditions of Lake Worth Middle School along Barnett Dr and 10th Avenue North. The audit was conducted in collaboration with the City of Lake Worth Beach, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Lake Worth Middle School, Safe Kids PBC, the Palm Beach County School District, Palm Beach County, and residents to improve safety and access for people of all ages and abilities.

POTENTIAL SOLUTIONS TO CONSIDER

Barnett Dr Roadway Owner: City of Lake Worth Beach	Time Frame
 Narrow travel lanes, widen sidewalks, and add mid-block crossings with refuge islands to create a safe place for students to cross the street and for large groups of students at dismissal. 	Short to Mid-Term
Add pedestrian scaled lighting where feasible.	Mid-Term
Barnett Dr & 10th Ave N Intersection Roadway Owners: City of Lake Worth Beach, Palm Beach County, and FDOT	
Signal timing upgrades for pedestrians.	Short-Term
 Upgrade pedestrian crossings to high-visibility crosswalks on all intersection legs, create ADA curb ramps, curb extensions, and tactile warning pads. 	Short to Mid-Term
• Evaluate necessity of southbound to eastbound left turn lane onto 10th Ave N.	Long-Term
10th Ave N Roadway Owners: Palm Beach County and FDOT	
 Increase the pedestran countdown at all signals during school release. 	Short-Term
 Utilize crossing guards at both I-95 exit ramps to help children cross the street safety. Install green conflict zone marking on existing bicycle lanes. Repair sidewalk, maintain trees, and bicycle lane on a more regular basis. 	Short to Mid-Term
Add pedestrian scaled lighting where feasible.	Mid-Term

^{*}FDOT will be constructing a Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) along 10th Ave N east of Barnett Dr that will include a shared-use path to accomodate bicyclists and pedestrians.
