Learning from our Partners

1. SS4A Overview

Darren Thacker, Transportation Specialist, Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)

- Agencies can apply for implementation funds once the Action Plan has already been adopted and meets the criteria on the Self-Certification Sheet
- Applicants may schedule a meeting with FHWA prior to applying to verify their eligibility and chances at receiving planning or implementation funds
- Grant applicants may reapply if their application is not initially selected for funding

2. Broward County SS4A Planning Grant Experience

Josette Severyn, AICP, Multimodal Mobility Projects Administrator, Broward County

- Broward MPO and Broward County jointly applied for Planning and Demonstration funds
- 20% match was provided through project construction using surtax funds and gas taxes
- Numerous multimodal transportation related studies were incorporated into their plan

3. Lessons Learned for Implementation Grants

Paola Baez, P.E, Chief of Multimodal Development Section, Miami-Dade County

- Requested all municipalities submitted High Injury Network (HIN) locations for inclusion into the County's HIN to ensure all priority areas are covered for implementation
- This process ensured all municipalities were eligible for implementation grant applications with a robust and cohesive approach
- The collaboration ensured neighboring agencies were not competing with one another
- Coordinated with key organizations, such as community liaisons, trauma centers, and hospitals to actively and collaboratively engage the public through outreach

4. Discussion

- Action Plan must be adopted before applying for implementation that meets the expectations set in FHWA's self-certification sheet
- For projects to be used as in-kind matches for implementation funds, they must meet the federal requirements set forth in the SS4A program
- Meeting regularly with your neighboring municipalities will ensure —cohesion along the process and ensure municipalities are not competing amongst each other
