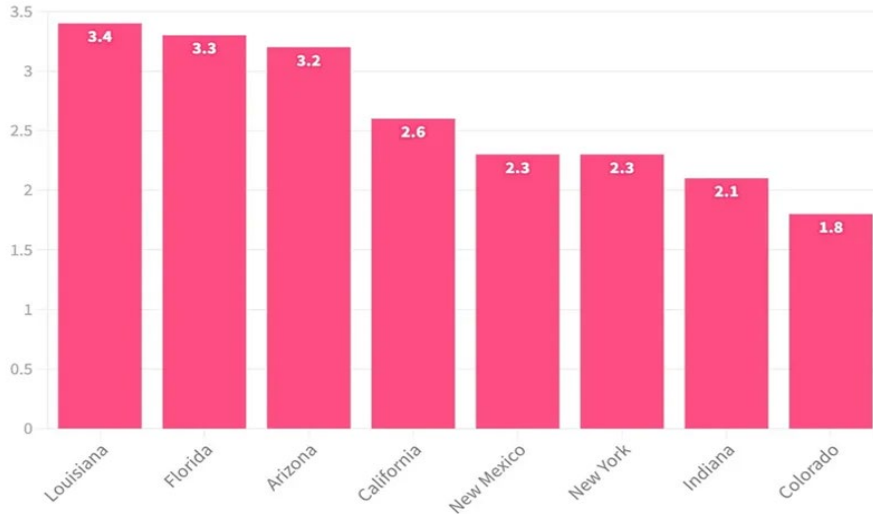


Riding at Risk
