



Roll-Forward Projects

Unused FY 2025 funding is rolled into FY 2026. Approval of this revision will restore consistency between the FDOT Work Program and the Palm Beach TPA's Transportation Improvement Program.

There are often project phases that were programmed in the previous fiscal year that do not get encumbered (prior to June 30). Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) funded projects automatically roll forward from the previous fiscal year to the new fiscal year in the FDOT Work Program but do not automatically roll forward in the TIP. To ensure that both the Work Program and TIP have a matching first year, FDOT submits the projects to the TPA to roll forward.

WHEREAS, the MPO's 50th Year Anniversary is November 10, 2027, and this presents an opportunity to reclaim the statutory organization name in support of future decades of public service.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PALM BEACH MPO, d/b/a PALM BEACH TRANSPORTATION PLANNING AGENCY, THAT:

- 1. The Palm Beach MPO approves the sunsetting of the use of the d/b/a name "Palm Beach Transportation Planning Agency."
- 2. The Palm Beach MPO approves the transition to be aligned with key milestones, including the FY 2027–2028 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), which will be adopted in spring 2026, and the organization's 50th anniversary in November 2027.
- 3. The Palm Beach MPO directs the Executive Director to take all necessary actions to effectuate usage of the legal name.
- 4. This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Returning from "Palm Beach TPA" to "Palm Beach MPO"

DATE: September 11, 2025

BACKGROUND

The purpose of this item is to seek direction from the Governing Board on discontinuing use of the d/b/a "Palm Beach TPA" and reaffirming consistent use of the agency's statutory name, the Palm Beach Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO).

Since 2017, we have been doing business as the Palm Beach TPA. While this name has served us well, reaffirming our statutory name will ensure consistency with federal and state partners, strengthen alignment with peer agencies, simplify administrative processes, and support continued community engagement.

The transition will be phased in gradually and coordinated with key milestones, including adoption of the FY 2027–2028 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) and the organization's 50th anniversary in 2027.

WHY RETURNING TO "PALM BEACH MPO" MATTERS

1. Alignment with Core Mission

Since 1977, our organization has been federally designated as the Palm Beach Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO). Our mission is to collaboratively plan and prioritize state and federal transportation funds in Palm Beach County's urban areas and approve federally and state-funded projects countywide through the Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) and Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The "MPO" name most accurately reflects this role and responsibilities.

2. Clarity and Consistency with Peers

There are 27 MPOs in Florida, and the majority use their statutory name. Palm Beach is one of only two MPOs in the state that operate under the "TPA" label. Nationally, nearly all Metropolitan Planning Organizations identify as MPOs.

Our state and federal partners, including FHWA, FTA, FDOT, AMPO, and MPOAC, exclusively use "MPO" terminology. Feedback from peer agencies indicates that "TPA" often creates confusion, while "MPO" provides immediate recognition and credibility.

3. Administrative Accuracy and Risk Reduction

Operating under two names has created irregularities in audits, reporting, contracts, and employee programs. Returning to our statutory name will streamline compliance, reduce risk, and ensure accuracy across all records.

4. Reinforcing Identity and Legacy

Returning to our statutory name reinforces our federal designation and positions us to celebrate our 50th anniversary in 2027 under an identity that reflects our true role. Our logo and branding will remain unchanged; only the name will shift back to MPO.

COST OF TRANSITION

The cost of this transition will be minimal and covered within the existing budget.

- Website and Branding: No new costs are anticipated. We already own the PalmBeachMPO.org domain, and logo updates can be completed in-house.
- **Signage:** Building signage will be updated to reflect the name change.
- Business Cards and Materials: Will be refreshed gradually through normal reordering cycles.

No new rebranding initiative is required.

TRANSITION PLAN

- Gradual Transition: Updates to signage, digital platforms, and materials will be phased in with full implementation by November 2027.
- **Strategic Timing:** Changes will align with key milestones, including the adoption of the FY 2027–2028 UPWP in spring 2026 and our 50th anniversary in 2027.
- Unified Identity: Returning to the MPO name will ensure consistency and clarity across all communications moving forward.

RECOMMENDATION

The Governing Board authorize transitioning back to the statutory name Palm Beach MPO for all official and public-facing purposes.

This change will:

- Reaffirm our federally designated role and responsibilities.
- Clarify our scope and reduce public confusion.
- Eliminate administrative risks associated with dual naming.
- Align us with state and national peer organizations.
- Preserve our strong branding and public engagement.
- Position us for a unified and proud 50th anniversary in 2027.






