

Countywide Transportation Master Plan (CTMP) Overview and Update

Purpose of CWTP

- Establish a multijurisdictional process and planning framework for a countywide vision for transportation and mobility that safely connects people to places.
- Incorporate an intergovernmental coordination approach as may be necessary to create an effective, convenient, and regionally connected multimodal system.
- Identify multimodal transportation needs, and establish a method for on-going intergovernmental coordination of land use and transportation projects.
- Used as a foundation for counties and municipalities to separately adopt and/or update their own specific plan of improvements and recommendations.
- The following four stages are associated with the Scope of Work for the Project.
 - 1. Discovery
 - 2. Envision
 - 3. Stragegize
 - 4. Enact



Background


- **July 17, 2024** BCC directed County staff to coordinate with representatives from the 39 municipalities in the development and release of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for transportation professionals for the development of a CTMP.
- The RFP was released on **December 12, 2024**, and closed on **March 4, 2025**; Three (3) proposals were received (*Alfred Benesch & Company, CTS Engineering, Inc., WSP USA Inc.*).
- Selection Committee Comprised of seven (7) voting members (3 municipal and 4 County representatives) and four (4) technical advisors or non-voting members (2 municipal and 2 County representatives)
 - **April 7, 2025** Shortlisted two (2) consulting firms (*WSP USA Inc. and Alfred Benesch & Company*) to give oral presentations
 - April 29, 2025 Ranked WSP USA Inc. first
- May 2025 Purchasing staff met with the representatives of WSP USA Inc. and negotiated the terms and conditions of the contract for professional services based on the RFP requirements.
- June 18, 2025 BCC approved contract with WSP USA Inc.
 - The consultant will work with County staff, technical group of stakeholders (IPARC 2.0 and MICFEC) regularly in the development of the CTMP.
 - As part of the process, presentations to all stakeholders at key project milestones will be held in various geographical locations within Palm Beach County (PBC).
 - The consultant will be tasked with building consensus through engagement with multiple public, private, and civic stakeholders and utilizing emerging technologies to develop an innovative CTMP to be considered and approved by the BCC.



CTMP Consultant Contract Terms & Conditions

- Commence July 1, 2025 and completion date of October 1, 2026 with three
 1-year options to renew
- \$995,191 Total Contract Amount funded entirely by the County
- Executed Performance Bond or Letter of Credit equal to the Contract Amount required to ensure faithful performance of Contract
- Scope of Services/Work (15 Tasks), Fee Proposal by Task and Month
- WSP USA Inc. Proposal Public Engagement Strategies with municipal, transportation, business, economic, and civic stakeholders via existing or new forums (such as IPARC 2.0, MICFEC)
- Multi-PBC departments in Core Team involved in project management with Planning Division


